baseball. He was a member of the varsity basketball team that reached the Final Four in 2000, but made his biggest contributions on the baseball diamond. As a freshman, he was awarded the prestigious Raymond May Award as the top scholar-athlete. He was a four year varsity letterman under Coach Michael Bridges and played catcher. Derek received many accolades following his senior year at Dora, including being an All-State selection by the Alabama Sports Writers Association as well as The Birmingham News. He was also selected to The Birmingham News All-Metro Team and All-Academic team. In additional, he was selected the Daily Mountain Eagle player of the year for the 2000 season. He was chosen to the Lions' Club East-West All-Star game. Derek graduated as an honor graduate and was fourth in his class. Derek's most proud moment of his high school career was receiving the Jon Black Memorial Scholarship his senior year, named in memory of his friend Jon Black who passed away in 1998.

At the time of his induction in 2021, he has won over 400 games as a head coach and won back-to-back state titles in 2013 and 2014 at Charles Henderson High School.
