
GEORGE MILLER

George was a 4 year participant in football, basketball, track. Curry did not have a high school baseball team, but George still had a love for the sport. In football, he started as a quarterback his 10th and 11th grade years. He changed to halfback his senior year. As a sophomore, his football team went 2 and 8. In his junior year, his team went 8-1-1 and was 4th in the state. His senior year, while playing halfback and still calling plays, his team went 9-0-1 and was 3rd in the state.

As a basketball player, George started in the 10th, 11th, and 12th grades. As a 10th grader, his team went 21-10 and was 4th in the state. George was named All-Conference, all-county and all 5th district tournament team. His 11th grade year his team went 23-6 and made it to the state tournament. George again was named to the All-County and all-conference teams. In his senior year, his team went 27-4. He was All-Conference (MVP), All-County (MVP) and All-State.



Even though his high school did not have a baseball team, he later played for the Jasper BABF team under the leadership of Chesley Barnett.

After graduation from Curry, he signed a basketball scholarship at Walker College. In his sophomore season his team was co-champion of the Dixie Conference.

After graduating from Walker College, he graduated from Livingston University (University of West Alabama) He then coached basketball, baseball, and football at Aliceville (Pickens County), Cobb County in Georgia, and in Walker County, Alabama, and Farmstead Jr. High. He was head basketball coach at Curry High School. While coaching at Curry, one of his teams won 2nd place in the Walker County tournament and another team was the Wal-Win conference champions.

Upon leaving the coaching ranks, George was principal at Boldo Junior High, Townley Junior High, and Curry Middle School.

George has been successful in sports and in life mainly because of his mother, Mary E. Miller, brothers, Eddie and Curt, Coach Travis Hudson, Coach Glen Clem, and all of his teammates.

George and his wife, Lyn, have 2 sons; Charley of Tallassee and Ben of Tuscaloosa. They also have a daughter, Jessica Teasley (Paul) Birmingham. They have a granddaughter, Ella Teasley and a grandson, Miller Teasley.
