KEVIN FOWLER WAS BORN AT VANDENBURG AIRFORCE BASE IN LOMPOC, CALIFORNIA, ON MAY 18, 1967,



to Ray and June Fowler. His family moved back to Alabama in 1974 after his father's retirement from the military. Kevin grew up in the Jasper school system becoming a standout pitcher for the Walker Vikings, as well as being a multi-year starter on the offensive line for the Vikings football team. During the spring of 1985, after several college offers, Kevin chose to continue his athletic and academic career at the University of Montevallo. The opportunity to pitch early for the Falcons helped make that decision an easy one for him.

Kevin was a pitcher for the Falcons baseball team from 1986-89. He made history on March 23, 1989, when he threw the only perfect game in Montevallo history against the Baldwin-Wallace Yellow Jackets. His time at Montevallo is reflected throughout the record books with multiple achievements, including first in career innings pitched with 311.1, second in career wins with 26, second in career strikeouts with 201, second all-time in career appearances with 74, second in career games started with 46, and third in career complete games with 18, First team ALL SSC 1987. Fowler went on to be selected by the Texas Rangers in the 37th round with the 948th pick in the 1989 MLB Draft where he spent two seasons in the minors. Kevin credits his parents and all his high school coaches for his successes. Kevin was inducted into the University of Montevallo Sports Hall of Fame in 2021.

After his career in baseball, Kevin began a career in the Public Housing Industry where he has spent 31 year serving the low-income housing sector. He has a BS from Montevallo, MPA from Jacksonville State and an MBA from UNA. He is currently the Executive Director for the Walker County Housing Authority since 2010 and the former Director of the Anniston Housing Authority from 1998-2010. He has been married to his wife, Shea, for 31 years and they have two children, Ashford and Ansley, who both attend the University of Alabama at Birmingham.
