S COTT WAS BORN IN TOWNLEY, ALABAMA, ON THE 3RD DAY OF JUNE, 1968, TO ROBERT AND DELORIS BROWN. SCOTT

showed early on his future athletic prowess when in the 9th grade, he was selected to the All-State Basketball Team at Townley Jr. High. Then at Walker High School, as a Junior, he became the First Walker County Decathlon Champion. That same year, he was selected as All-County in Basketball and Most Valuable Defensive Back in Football. From that point on, the awards came too fast to keep up with. He was selected as the MVP Defensive Back, MVP Defensive Player in Football, as well as, MVP Basketball, All-County Basketball, All-County Football and Captain of the Football team. Then, to go along with those awards were All-Metro and First Team All-State.

Scott was not only a great athlete, but an excellent student. He was a member of the National Honor Society, the Beta Club, and an Army Reserve National Scholar. All this while lettering in football, basketball, and track. Upon graduation, he received a full scholarship to play football at Vanderbilt University. Because of his size and love of contact, he was moved to outside linebacker, where he was a three year starter and the second leading tackler for the Commodores, both his junior and senior years. Scott, still an excellent student, graduated from Vandy in 3½ years.

Scott began his career working at Birmingham Steel Corporation in 1990 and spent his entire career in the steel industry working for several different companies. In 2004, Scott accomplished his dream of owning his own company by founding SRF, LLC which specialized in commodity trading, freight and logistics management, procurement and technical services. In 2013, Scott sold his company to Wynnchurch Capital, LP and retired.

He and his wife Kelli Harris Brown have two children: a son Cody, a history teacher and football coach at Jasper High School (his wife Alyssa Knight Brown, a RN); and daughter Anslee Brown Sparkman, a special education teacher in Gulf Shores (her husband Jacob Sparkman is a special education teacher and football coach at Gulf Shores High School).
