ARYL JOHNSON WAS BORN OCTOBER 7, 1977 TO DAVID AND BONNIE JOHNSON. HIS PASSION FOR SPORTS became apparent early on and was cultivated through the unwavering support of his entire family and community. Although he played many sports, he still is most proud of his football and basketball careers all while maintaining high academic standards.

Daryl started playing football at Curry High School as an offensive tackle on the Junior Varstiy team while also playing as a running back and free safety on the Varsity team. During his Sophomore year he was moved to wide receiver. He was an All-State Honorable Mention and named to the Eagle Elite Team by the Daily Mountain Eagle. During his Junior season, he earned All-State Honors from the Alabama High School Athletic Association and the Birmingham News. He was also selected to the Eagle Elite Team for a second consecutive year. During his Senior season, he led the state in receiving touchdowns which was instrumental in leading Curry High School to the third round of the state playoffs. He earned All-State Honors from the Alabama High School Athletic Association for the second



consecutive year. In addition, he was also named to the All-Metro and Super All-Metro Team on behalf of the Birmingham News and The Birmingham Post Herald. He was also selected to the Eagle Elite Team for the third consecutive year.
