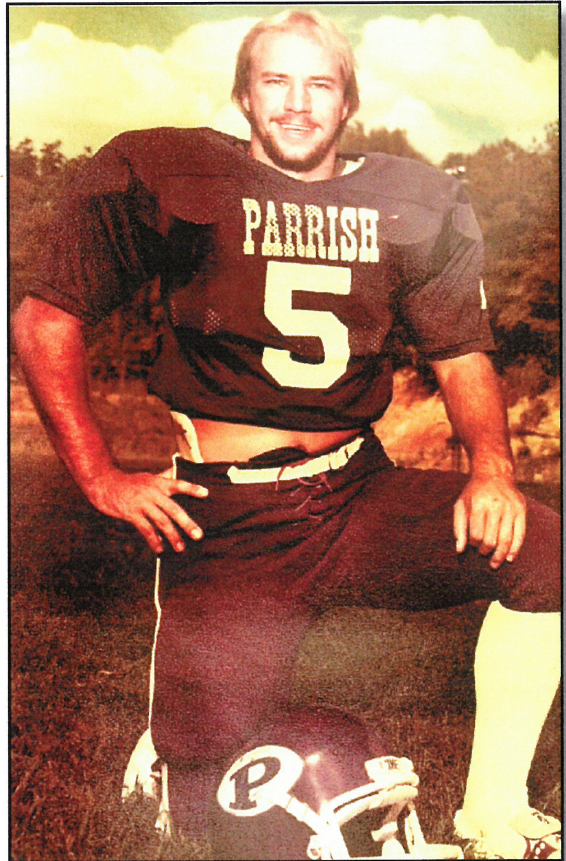


FLAVEL URWANE WESTBROOK

URWANE WAS BORN JANUARY 5, 1964, TO ANN AND MOONIE WESTBROOK. AT THE AGE OF

12 he won Most Outstanding Player at the Punt, Pass and Kick Camp. Then at 15, he won the Most Outstanding Player Award at the Auburn University Football Camp.

He attended Parrish High School where his freshman year he made All-County, then followed that up his sophomore year by leading the Tornadoes to their first ever state play-off game. He carried the ball 15 times for 109 yards, scored 2 touchdowns, and a 2 point conversion to lead them to a 29-0 win over Gordo. His junior year, he was the leading rusher in the county with 1,642 yards and 122 points while being chosen All-County, All-Area, and Montgomery Advertiser and Birmingham Post Herald 1st team All-State.



Urwane was also selected as the Most Valuable Back for the State of Alabama in Class1A. He led the Tornadoes to their first undefeated regular season. To add to a growing list of honors, he was chosen as a 1980 Centenary All-American. His senior year, he rushed for 1,604 yards and 115 points and made All-County, All-Area, All-State, Daily Mountain Eagle Player of the Year, McDonald's Offensive Player of the Year, and was inducted into Who's Who in American High School Football in 1981.

Urwane received a scholarship to play football at the University of North Alabama where a broken ankle his freshman year, eventually, led to the end of his football career. In 2009, he was inducted into the Parrish High School Football Hall-of-Fame.

Urwane Westbrook passed away March 18, 2016 at the age of 52. His legacy as an athlete will always be remembered, but he also left a legacy as a person, role model, family man, friend, and co-worker that will continue to affect those who knew him. He is survived by his three children: Alex, Autumn and Tristan.
