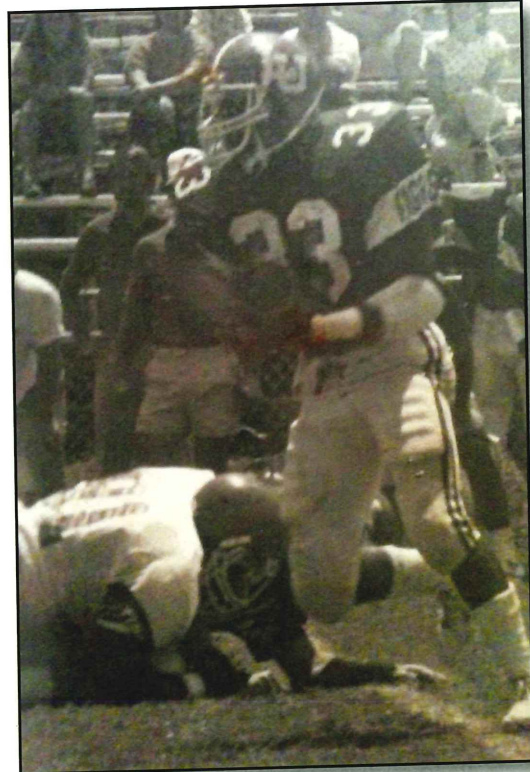


MICHAEL BRIDGES

MICHAEL "BAY BAY" BRIDGES
WAS BORN MAY 21, 1964, TO
HENRY AND DAISY BRIDGES OF

Cordova, Alabama. Being the youngest son of 13 children, Bay Bay was destined to be an athlete. While attending school at Cordova High School, Bay Bay played football, baseball and basketball. He was an All-County selection in all 3 sports, All-Area in football and baseball, and All-State in football. His senior year, he was named the All-County Offensive Player of the Year. Upon graduating from Cordova High School in 1983, Bay Bay signed at West Alabama in Football. While at West Alabama playing football, he lettered 3 years and scored 8 touchdowns his senior year. He also played



baseball at West Alabama for years 1986 and 1988. In 1986, he had a .310 batting average and in 1988, he had .383. His lifetime batting average was .347. This was the 2nd highest in school history for many years.

Upon graduating from West Alabama in 1989, he worked as a Social Worker for 5 years. After this, he began teaching and coaching in 1995 to the present. During his 27 years of coaching, he has coached basketball, baseball, and football. He has been head coach in all 3 sports. In 2003, Bay Bay became the defensive coordinator at Parrish High School. While there, they won the 1A State Championship at Legion Field. Bay Bay is currently the Head Basketball Coach at Dora High School where they have made it to the Elite 8 and Sweet 16, won Area Championships and County Championships. Bay Bay gives back to his community by also Coaching a team within the Birmingham Baseball Industrial League.

Bay Bay is the proud father of Cordriqus and Michael that currently live in Atlanta, Georgia and Paris Bridges who is a varsity cheerleader for Thompson High School.
