
NORMAN EDWARD HOLT

Norman was also a member of Dora's first wrestling team, where he qualified to participate in the State Tournament.



Upon graduation, Norman received both football and baseball scholarship offers. He chose to play baseball at Freed-Hardman University in Henderson, Tennessee, where he lettered four years. His teammates selected him co-captain his senior year. He led the team in batting average, defense, and stolen bases. He was selected the 1982-1983 Freed-Hardman Senior Male Athlete of the Year and graduated with a BS degree in Management.

After college graduation, he moved back to Walker County and worked for 28 years as a loan officer at First National Bank in Jasper, and was the branch manager/senior lender at Alabama Trust Credit Union for 3 years. Norman served in various service organizations such as: Lions Club, United Way, DHS Booster Club, DHS Band Boosters, Dora Gas & Water Board, as well as, coaching various athletic teams. He currently is the Chairman of the Deacons at Dora First Baptist.

Norman has been married to his high school sweetheart, Pamela Tucker for 38 years. They have two daughters: Jennifer Holt Jarvis and Kimber Holt Sanford, and four grandchildren; Hayleigh Jarvis, Austin Jarvis, Karson Sanford, and Kiley Sanford.
