
LISA MAY-ATKINS

In her four years at DHS, Lisa earned MVP, All County, and All State honors in volleyball and softball. Additionally, in volleyball, Lisa was named AJCCC MVP and Player of the Year and was honored as NJCAA All American Nominee during her sophomore campaign. Lisa earned a volleyball scholarship to Jacksonville State University where she finished her playing career earning All-Conference Newcomer of the Year as a junior and All Conference team as a senior along with several other records and accomplishments.

After graduating from Jacksonville State University, Lisa took a coaching position at Wallace State Hanceville. During her six year run as head volleyball coach, the Lady Lions won four Conference, Regional, and District titles and earned four National Championship appearances. Lisa was awarded ACCC Coach of the Year and NJCAA Regional Coach of the Year in 2000, 2001, 2002, and 2003. She also served as the Lady Lions assistant softball coach which was also very successful and earned a Conference and Regional Championship sending them to the NJCAA World Series.

After deciding to leave Wallace State and coaching in 2005, Lisa moved to Northport, AL with her husband Mark. Their son Travis was born in 2009. She is a member of the Junior League of Tuscaloosa and volunteers regularly at American Christian Academy where her son attends school. Lisa co-founded the Capstone Sports Foundation along with her son Travis in 2017.
